	Neurodevelopment Assessment Pathway – Early Years	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A specialist multi-agency assessment of the developmental needs of children referred in with difficulties around communication and social interaction. Key professionals involved in the assessment can include: Speech and Language Therapy; Clinical Psychology; Paediatrician and other relevant support agencies dependent upon the individual needs of the child being assessed. Children commonly exhibit behaviours suggestive of a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder. This pathway offers a time limited, targeted assessment and makes recommendations to universal and targeted services, to ensure the child's developmental needs are met. Children referred onto this pathway will already be in receipt of support through the Early Help system, and assessment findings and recommendations are fed back directly or through this forum.
